



2022 Profile of ASHA Members and Affiliates With PhDs

Introduction

This report presents data on ASHA members and affiliates who hold a research doctorate (PhD). Data are presented by ASHA certification status, United States residency, race, ethnicity, sex, age, primary employment facility, and private practice status.

Highlights

- **Overall Counts and ASHA Certification Status.** ASHA currently represents 4,498 individuals who hold a PhD. Of these, 710 hold ASHA certification in audiology, 3,226 hold ASHA certification in speech-language pathology, 113 hold dual certification, 63 are in the process of obtaining ASHA certification, and 386 are not ASHA-certified.
- **Residency.** Among the 4,498 ASHA constituents with PhDs, 4,231 reside in the U.S., and 267 reside in 42 other countries. One hundred thirty-one of the constituents are international affiliates.
- **Race and Ethnicity.** About one-fifth (16.9%) of ASHA constituents with PhDs who reside in the U.S. self-identify as American Indian or Alaska Native, Asian, Black or African American, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, or multiracial vs. 8.9% of all constituents. The percentage of those who self-identify as Hispanic or Latino is about the same for both populations (4.4% of PhD holders vs. 6.4% of all constituents).
- **Sex and Age.** About three-quarters (78.7%) of ASHA constituents with PhDs who reside in the U.S. self-identify as female, and 51.7% are ages 55 and older. In comparison, 95.7% of all ASHA constituents self-identify as female, and 21.7% are ages 55 and older.
- **Work Setting.** Across all ASHA constituents, only 3.0% report their primary employment facility as a college/university. For those who hold a PhD and ASHA certification in audiology, speech-language pathology, or both professions, the percentages jump to 47.1%, 57.7%, and 40.4%, respectively.
- **Private Practice Status.** Of those who hold a PhD and ASHA certification in audiology, 13.1% work in private practice either full or part time. The percentages are 21.8% and 39.0% for those who hold a PhD and ASHA certification in speech-language pathology or both professions, respectively. Across all ASHA constituents, the percentages working in private practice either full or part time are 31.8%, 23.1%, and 33.4%, respectively, for ASHA-certified audiologists, ASHA-certified speech-language pathologists, and those with dual certification.
